Project Ohio brings electricity to remote village in Guatemala

On Friday, January 24, 15 volunteer lineworkers from 10 Ohio electric cooperatives returned home from an electrification mission in Guatemala. During the 17-day trip, the Project Ohio team successfully brought electricity to 93 homes in the remote village of Barejones, in the Jalapa region of Guatemala. The team was able to install primary and secondary conductors, set meter poles and pole-mounted lights, and perform in-home electrical work. The team also continued previous work done by Oklahoma Electric Cooperatives in establishing a distribution system to the village.

Hancock-Wood's Clint Patterson was on the team, and this was his second time volunteering for the Project Ohio program. "When asked if I would be interested in going to Guatemala again, I immediately said 'yes.' It's an opportunity to change lives, including mine," Clint said.

Additionally, thanks to generous donations made by Ohio electric cooperative employees, the team was able to repair the village school's septic system, build a fence around the school's playground, provide water filters for each house, school, and church in the village, and give shoes to the village children. The team also provided school supplies and equipment for the school. Hancock-Wood Electric Cooperative's President and Bill Barnhart said, "We are very proud of this team and Clint's dedication to represent electric cooperatives in Ohio." This was Ohio's fifth Project Ohio mission to Guatemala. Hancock-Wood linemen have assisted in three of the missions.
